## Task

### Tracing the love story

Through studying key passages you are going to trace the development of love between Jane and Mr Rochester. By the end of your study you should be ready to write an essay-style answer on the presentation of the love story between Jane and Mr Rochester.



Use quotations from the text as much as possible in your answers.

### *Extract one: the first meeting, Chapter 12*

---

- 1) What are your first impressions of Mr Rochester?
- 2) What effect does Mr Rochester have on Jane?
- 3) Why is it significant that Jane helps Mr Rochester in this first encounter?

### *Extract two: conversations in the study, Chapter 13*

---

- 1) What further details do we get of Mr Rochester's appearance in this section?
- 2) How does Jane talk with Mr Rochester in these conversations?
- 3) Why do Jane's paintings impress Mr Rochester?

You could also study the conversation Jane and Mr Rochester have in the following chapter and look for suggestions that Mr Rochester is becoming attracted to Jane.

### *Extract three: saving Mr Rochester from the fire, Chapter 15*

---

- 1) How and why have Jane's feelings for Mr Rochester changed by this point in the story? You could consider both before the fire and after the fire.
- 2) How can we tell from Jane's description of his behaviour and speech that Mr Rochester is now attracted to Jane?
- 3) Why is it significant that Jane saves Mr Rochester?

***Extract four: Mr Rochester acts as a fortune teller, Chapter 19***

---

- 1) How does Mr Rochester, as the gypsy, hint that he loves Jane?
- 2) How does Mr Rochester try to trick Jane into saying that she loves him?

***Extract five: Mr Rochester proposes, Chapter 23***

---

- 1) How does the reader know that Mr Rochester intends to propose to Jane?
- 2) What are Jane's feelings about leaving Mr Rochester?
- 3) Why does Mr Rochester love Jane?
- 4) Why does Jane love Mr Rochester?

***Extract six: Jane leaves Mr Rochester, Chapter 27***

---

- 1) How does Mr Rochester compare his feelings for Jane to his feelings for Bertha?
- 2) How does Jane feel about Mr Rochester at this point?
- 3) Why does Jane feel she has to leave Mr Rochester, even though she still loves him?

***Extract seven: Jane meets Mr Rochester at Ferndean, Chapter 37***

---

- 1) When Jane first sees Mr Rochester, how does she feel about him?
- 2) How does Mr Rochester feel when he knows that Jane has come back to him?
- 3) How does the final meeting between Jane and Mr Rochester remind you of their first meeting?
- 4) Why are Jane and Rochester better suited to each other now?
